#### **Course Contents:**

#### **Unit A: Military leadership, Man management in Armed Force, Military awards & Decoration**

- a. Discipline: Definition, purpose & tools of maintaining discipline. Discipline and duties of a citizen, leadership traits.
- b. Awareness of major problems -- communal problem, health, sanitation, public service. Economic, handicaps, ignorance of education. Forest ecology and wild life, Health and Hygiene, infective diseases, personal hygiene and preventive diseases, water supply, disposal of garbage.
- c. Personality: traits, group behavior and communication skills in organizing armed force.
- d. Leadership: Meaning, definition, types & levels. Theories of leadership. Military leadership - meaning, attribute, importance and role in training & warfare.
- e. Man management -- concept, importance - Motivation and morale factors and their utilization in the armed forces.
- f. Awards & Decoration: Military orders, decoration, medals, awards and Honours – international aspects. Military awards and decorations of India.

### **A. Tactical Exercise without Troops**

1. Sand model on the following : a) attack, b) defense
2. Outline organization of Infantry Battalion in Lab Note Book
3. Chart showing organization, weapons at equipments at platoon level
4. Field crafts:
  - (a) Study and description of ground
  - (b) Judging distance – visual training & observation (use of Cover, concealment and camouflage)
  - (c) Indication, Recognition and description of targets
  - (d) Field Signals, Fire control order, Section formations, Platoon formations
5. Verbal order at Platoon level
6. Movement without arms and section Battle Drill
7. Patrolling: (1) Rescue Patrol (2) preparation (3) conduct and (4) de- briefing
8. Message Writing

### **B. Drill without arms**

1. Sizing, forming up in three ranks, numbering, open and close order march and dressing
2. Getting on parade, dismissing and fall out
3. Saluting at the halt
4. Marching, length of space and time of marching, marching in quick time and halt
5. Turning at the march and wheeling
6. Saluting at the march
7. Side space, pace forward and to the rear
8. Marking time, forward and halt in quick time and changing step
9. Formation of squad and squad drill

### **C. News paper clippings :**

**D. Field visit:** Field visit to defense establishment/ places of military interests. Students will submit a field report.
