\*\* Special Office Note : With reference to Office Order No.  
VU/UG/Law/3 year LL.B/766/09 dated 16.06.09,  
it may be mentioned here that -  
(i) 1st Semester of 1st Batch under Revised Regulations (w.e.f. 2009-10)  
will commence from 1st week of November, 2009. Gradually it will be set  
forward & finally it will be held on July of each year from 2011 or  
beforehand.

Subsequently, University Written Examination of 1st Semester of the 1st Batch under Revised Regulations (2009-10) will be held in April 2010 & gradually it will be forwarded, so that, ultimately the Examination is regularised and held in December in each year.

(ii) 2nd Semester of 1st Batch under Revised Regulations (w.e.f. 2009-10) will commence from 1st week of May 2010. Gradually it will be set forward & finally it will be held on January in each year. Subsequently, University written Examination of 2nd Semester of the 1st Batch under Revised Regulations (2009-10) will be held in October 2010 & gradually it will be forwarded, so that, ultimately the Examination is regularised and held in June in each year.

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

The Revised Rules and Regulations for the Admission and Examinations of FIVE YEARS B.A. LL.B. (Hons) Course and the THREE YEARS LL.B. Course of the University.

I. THE DEGREE OF LL.B.

The Degree of LL.B. may be conferred to such candidates who have :

- i. (a) Secured a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate at Graduation and such candidate's admission was confirmed through admission test for Three years LL.B. to be conducted by the Concerned College.
- (b) Secured a minimum of 45% marks to aggregate at 10 + 2 pattern and such candidate's admission was confirmed through Admission Test of Five Years LL.B. (Hons) to be conducted by the concerned College. Age limit 20 years at the time of Selection (2 years relaxation for reserved category)
- ii. received regular instructions
- iii. attended not less than 75% of the classes held
- iv. undergone required practical training
- v. maintained good moral character and
- vi. have complied with such other condition or conditions as may be laid down by the competent authority of the University from time to time.



## CURRICULUM OF STUDIES

The curriculum of studies shall consist of Thirty papers of one hundred marks each for Three year LL.B. Course and Sixty Papers of one hundred marks each for Five years B.A. LL.B (Hons) course.

## DURATION OF THE COURSE

The duration of the course shall be three academic years (Six Semesters) for three years LL.B. course and for Five years B.A. LL.B (Hons) Course the duration of the course shall be five academic years (Ten semesters)

## THE SYSTEM, METHODOLOGY AND MECHANISM OF EVALUATION

### A. EVALUATION OF TAUGHT PAPERS


General Scheme : All Taught papers shall carry 100 marks.

The performances of the students in each taught paper shall be assessed through External Assessment (done by the University) and internal Assessment (done by the Colleges as per University instruction). The External Assessment shall carry 80 marks and the Internal Assessment shall also carry 20 marks. Internal Assessment be done through atleast 3 College Test & Average of 3 Class Test be sent to University. Scripts will be preserved by the College Concerned for atleast 2 years.

E. External Assessment : The External Assessment which carries 80 marks shall be done through an End Semester Examination conducted by the University during the First week of the 6th month of each Semester. The detailed rules of the External Assessment shall be as under :

### Eligibility for taking the End Semester Written Examinations :

Students who have not attended 75% of the classes held and secured pass marks in the Internal Assessment of all Taught Papers shall not be allowed to take the End Semester Written Examination.



## Appointment of Paper Setters, Moderators, Examiners and

### Tabulators : The Paper Setters, Moderators, Examiners and


Tabulators shall be appointed by the competent authority of the University in accordance with the established norms followed by the University. Keeping in mind the Semester-based system and professional nature of the Course as far as practicable, there shall be two Paper Setters for each paper.

### Full marks, Pattern and Duration of the End Semester Written

#### Examination : The End Semester Written Examination shall

carry 80 marks and shall be of three (3) hours duration. In general, the End Semester Written Examination should ideally be based on requiring the students to apply the legal principles (which they have learnt in course of their study) to various practical problems of ground reality so that the Examination does not turn out to be a mere test of memory. The Question Papers to be prepared for the End Semester as per University norms. Written Examination shall contain 07 Seven questions of fifteen (15) marks carrying the syllabus and the examinees shall be asked to write four questions out of the said ~~six~~ seven (7) Questions. As far as practicable questions shall be framed in such a manner so that each question consists of two parts wherein the first part shall be theory based and the last part shall be problem based.

#### d. Time and venue of the End Semester Written Examination:

The External Assessment shall be done through an End Semester Written Examination conducted by the University during the First week of the 6th month (i.e. First week of June for the Semester that commences on and from the month of January and the First week of December for the Semester that commences on and from the month of July) of each Semester. The exact date and time of such Examination shall be decided by the competent authority of the University and shall be duly notified and communicated to the Colleges at least fifteen days before the commencement of the End Semester Written Examination. ~~xxvxxix~~ Regarding venue of written examinations of the University Home Centre will not be allowed. 

## EVALUATION OF PRACTICAL PAPERS

All practical Papers (i.e. Paper XXXIII Moot Court, Preparations and Participations in Trial Proceedings, Paper XXXIV Drafting, Pleading and conveyancing, Paper XXXV Professional Ethics, Accountancy for Lawyers and Bar Bench Relations and Paper XXXVI Public Interest Lawyering, Legal Aid and Paralegal Services) shall be assessed through Internal Assessment conducted by the Colleges strictly in accordance with guidelines laid down by the Bar Council of India.

At the end of the VIth Semester (for Three year LL.B) and Xth Semester (for Five Years B.A. LL.B. (Hons)) the Colleges are required to send a statement showing the marks secured by the students in the Practical Paper.

## PUBLICATION OF THE RESULT, PROMOTION AND PASS MARKS

The End Semester Written Examination to be conducted by the University shall be held during the First Week of the 6th month (i.e. First Week of June for the Semester that commences on and from the month of January and the First Week of December for the Semester that commences on and from the month of July) of each Semester.

1. All written papers of the End Semester-Written-Examination shall be evaluated and examined as early as possible. The papers of the End-Term-Written-Examination shall be examined and assessed through suitable system as it be fit for the Authority.

iii. The results of a Semester shall be published and be made available to the students within two months from the date of completion of the End-Semester-Written-Examination.

iv. A student who has attended 75% of the classes held and appeared in all the papers of the End-Semester-Written Examination shall automatically be promoted to subsequent semester for attending the classes concerned.

v. A student is required to secure an aggregate 40% marks (i.e. 240 marks in aggregate) besides securing a minimum pass marks of 30% in each paper (whether the same is a Taught Paper or Seminar Paper or Practical Paper) for passing a semester. in 5 years LL.B (H) Course. And in case of 3 years LL.B. Course a student is required to secure an aggregate ~~40% marks (i.e. 200 marks in aggregate)~~ besides securing a minimum ~~Pass~~ Pass marks of 30% in each paper (Taught Paper/ Seminar Paper/Practical Paper) for Passing a Semester.

vi. A student failing in a Semester Examination is not eligible to ~~not~~ sit for the next End Semester Examination.

vii. A student who has got below 30% ~~marks~~ in one or more (Maximum three) Paper/Papers shall be required to appear in the Written Examination of the Paper/Papers in which he/she has got below 30% marks along with the students of the following batch and if a student fails to secure 30% Marks in the Paper/Papers taken by him/her again, after the third attempt he/she shall be required to register himself/herself for that Semester and shall be required to take all Papers offered in the particular semester again.

viii. A student who has got 60% and above marks in aggregate be awarded 1st class and a student securing 50% and above but below 60% marks in aggregate be awarded 2nd class.
